READING CRITICALLY. This handout is available in an alternative format on request. Critical reading is a more ACTIVE way of reading. It is a deeper and more complex engagement with a text. Critical reading is a process of analyzing, interpreting and, sometimes, evaluating. When we read critically, we use our critical thinking skills to QUESTION both the text and our own reading of it.

READING CRITICALLY - University of Toronto

CRITICAL READING is an involved version of reading that uses specific processes, models, questions, and theories to help a reader COMPREHEND the text on a more complex level. It is the opposite of "skimming" and helps a reader get at the DEEPER STRUCTURE of the reading to break down the content into a true, logical understanding.
