### **Delay and Disruption - Completion - FIDIC**

"The Contractor shall be entitled subject to Sub-Clause 20.1 [Contractor's Claims] to an extension of the Time for Completion

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if and to the extent that completion for the purposes of Sub-Clause 10.1 [Taking Over of the Works and Sections] is or will be delayed by any of the following causes: [...] Unforeseeable shortages in the availability of personnel or Goods caused by epidemic or governmental actions, or [...]"

## **COVID-19: FIDIC and Claims for Additional Time & Money in ...**

"The Contractor shall be entitled subject to Sub-Clause 20.1 [Contractor's Claims] to an extension of the Time for Completion if and to the extent that completion for the purposes of Sub-Clause 10.1 [Taking Over of the Works and Sections] is or will be delayed by any of the following causes: [...] Unforeseeable shortages in the availability of personnel or Goods caused by epidemic or governmental actions, or [...]"

## **Guideline for preparing comprehensive extension of time**

It considers how delay and disruption are dealt with in a typical building contract, what remedies the occurrence of a delaying or disrupting event may entitle the contractor to, and the situation where the delayed works are the result of damage caused by a third party to the land on which the site is located.

## **A Guide to Claims - FIDIC Red Book 1999**

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When an item of work is unable to finish at an anticipated date due to some event/s, and this item of work is on the critical path of a project programme, the project is delayed. Where the item of work is not on the critical path, but the timing of the work has to be altered, the works are disrupted.

## **CLAIMS UNDER THE NEW FIDIC CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT JOHN ...**

For the purpose of prolongation cost claims, the delay(s) to the completion must be the consequence of a compensable delay to the completion of the works (i.e. it is a direct result of a site instruction, variation or change order, the occurrence of a specified employer's risk event) or employer's breach (e.g. an act of prevention, denied ...

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## **Prolongation Cost Claims: The Basic Principles | News ...**

For contracts based on the FIDIC Red Book (1999), contractors may cite to “unforeseeable shortages in the availability of personnel or Goods caused by the epidemic or governmental actions” as one of the grounds for an extension of time for completion. Naturally, this clause can only be raised if the shortage of personnel or goods was actually impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Delay or disruption affecting the progress of the works on a construction project is dealt with in different ways, depending on the cause of it and its impact on the contractor’s ability to complete the works in accordance with the contractual programme.

As a result, one now sees more contracts amended to favour the employer by disentitling the contractor to the EOT in circumstances of concurrent delay. The 2017 FIDIC clause 8.5 anticipates the possibility of the parties adopting a set of rules in this regard, such as the SCL Delay and Disruption Protocol. Clause 8.5 states:

## **No EOT for Concurrent Delay, if so Agreed « Corbett & Co ...**

The SCL Delay and Disruption Protocol 2nd edition provided that “The Contractor has a general duty to mitigate the effect on its works of Employer Risk Events. Subject to express contract wording or agreement to the contrary, the duty to mitigate does not extend to requiring the Contractor to add extra resources or to work outside its planned working hours.

## **Understanding the difference between Mitigation and ...**

The implementation of travel restrictions, lock-downs, stay-at-home orders, and curfews, in an attempt to curtail the spread of the COVID-19 virus, has led to delays in the completion of construction projects. Contractors are thus faced with worrying

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about the potential implications of such delays.

## **HOW CONTRACTORS CAN DEAL WITH DELAYS AND DISRUPTIONS OF ...**

Delays in activities for which there is programme float available (i.e. they can be delayed without impacting on the completion date). Delays that will impact on the completion date, sometimes referred to as critical delays. Construction contracts tend provide for four categories of delay: Delays resulting from neutral causes.
