Production is carried out in power stations. Electricity is most often generated at a power plant by electromechanical generators, primarily driven by heat engines fueled by combustion or nuclear fission but also by

In 2019, about 63% of U.S. utility-scale electricity generation was produced from fossil fuels (coal, natural gas, and petroleum), about 20% was from nuclear energy, and about 17% was from renewable energy sources. The shares of utility-scale electricity generation by major energy sources in 2019 were; natural gas 38%; coal 23%; nuclear 20%

Electricity generation, capacity, and sales in the United ...

Most of U.S. electricity generation is from electric power plants that use a turbine or similar machine to drive electricity generators. A turbine converts the potential and kinetic energy of a moving fluid (liquid or gas) to mechanical energy. In a turbine generator, a moving fluid—such as water, steam, combustion gases, or air—pushes a series of blades mounted on a shaft, which rotates the shaft connected to a generator.

Electricity is an energy currency, rather than an energy source, which means that electrical generation needs to start from a primary energy source like a fuel or a primary energy flow. These fuels and flows are usually turned into electric current which transmits electric power to the grid. Power plants are the most commonly used energy conversion technology to create electricity from primary energy.

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Electricity generation Solar radiation may be converted directly into electricity by solar cells (photovoltaic cells). In such cells, a small electric voltage is generated when light strikes the junction between a metal and a semiconductor (such as silicon) or the junction between two different semiconductors.
