Governing Documents - Charity Central

A constitution is a crucial document that states the fundamental principles that govern all the operations of a charity institution. The governing document mainly focuses on the legal aspects and provides clearly defined guidelines for all kinds of purposes and procedures.

What is a governing document? It is a set of rules for the way you run your charity. The rules include the purposes and powers of your charity, and other arrangements like how many trustees you will have, how they are appointed or elected, how to give notice of meetings, how to call a general meeting (e.g. AGM), and how to wind-up (close) the charity.

Governance, accounts and record keeping: Charities must keep good records, which should include details of their finances, charitable activities, and trustees. They must adhere to the rules in their governing document (e.g. constitution). Registered charities must send information to the Charity Commission each year.

Legal structures for community groups and not-for-profit ...

A charity's governing document contains the organisation's purposes. To be charitable, your organisation must have exclusively charitable purposes. This means that each purpose must fall within one or more of the 12 descriptions of purpose in the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008 and be for the public benefit.

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
