Include an in-text citation when you refer to, summarize, paraphrase, or quote from another source. Use the author-page style for in-text citations. The in-text citation for a website contains either the author's name or the title of the source in parentheses. If you cite multiple pages or articles from the same website, you should include a separate Works Cited entry for each one.

Narrative citation. A narrative MLA in-text citation is when the author's name is used in the text of the sentence. At the end of the sentence, in parentheses, is the page number where the information was found.

MLA In-Text Citation & Parenthetical Guide

Basic book citation format. The APA in-text citation for a book includes the author's last name, the year, and (if relevant) a page number. In the reference list, start with the author's last name and initials, followed by the year. The book title is written in sentence case (only capitalize the first word and any proper nouns).

Give the secondary source in the reference list; in text, name the original work and give a citation for the secondary source. For example, if Allport's work is cited in Nicholson and you did not read Allport's work, list the Nicholson reference in the reference list. In the text, use the following citation:

Include an in-text citation next to the paraphrased information. What paraphrases are not: A copy and pasted sentence with a few words substituted for synonyms.
