State laws that are specific to nursing practice are typically called nursing practice acts and associated rules and regulations. 2 The objective of any state's nursing practice act as it pertains to documentation is the same across the country: to provide a clear and accurate picture of the patient while under

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the care of the healthcare team. State law mandates a broad objective such as this and leaves the details to healthcare institutions, specialty organizations, and practice groups.

DOCUMENTATION. Documentation must reflect the complexity of care, and it must embody accuracy, completeness, and evidence of professional practice with efficient and cost-effective systems. The clinical standards (structure, outcome, process, and evaluation) are used to develop a system that complies with legal, accreditation, and professional practice requirements of documentation.

## **Defending yourself through documentation - American Nurse**

The expert will look at the nursing documentation for clues and evidence that the care rendered wasn't consistent with appropriate nursing care in order to form an expert opinion. If the plaintiff proves all four elements, damages will likely be awarded to compensate the plaintiff for economic losses (medical costs, lost wages) and noneconomic losses (pain and suffering).

It means that the nurse has compounded a medical error with false documentation by omission, for which there may be serious legal consequences. Regardless of format, charting should always include any change in client's condition, any treatments, medications, or other interventions, client responses, and any

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complaints of family or client.

A long-standing, essential principle of nursing documentation is that it be truthful and accurate. Moreover, you as a nurse are responsible for your own documentation. If you document for another, you must alert the reader of that fact by indicating you are doing so for the identified nurse (by name) and then signing your name after the notation.
