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### Lesson Plan For Enzymes Beam

The 2 basic players in enzymatic reactions are enzymes and substrates. The substrates can only fit into the active sites of very specific enzymes, so not all enzymes can synthesize or decompose all substrates. The enzyme attaches to the substrate at an area called the active site. The combination is called the enzyme/substrate complex.

An enzyme is considered inactive if it does not work anymore. Each kind of enzyme has a certain environment in which it works best, or in which it is most active. Enzymes in our bodies, for example, are most active at body temperature (about 37°C or 98.6°F). If you heat an enzyme too much, it will usually be destroyed.

Enzymes are proteins that perform a specific chemical reaction. Chymosin, for example, is an enzyme derived from rennet that alters the casein micelle structure to make milk curdle. Proteases are other enzymes that disrupt the casein micelle structure by chopping up proteins, causing milk to curdle.

Continue adding enzymes and their substrates to the columns (e.g., lactase-lactose, protease-proteins, lipase-lipids). "What is the pattern?" (Enzymes end in -ase. The substrate and the enzyme have the same root).
