Geoffrey de St. Leger, Bishop of Ossory (1260-1286), seems to have been the head of this family, for in 1317 William de St. Leger granted to his son James all messuages, lands, &c., which he had in Balyustre and in Kylhalary in the tenement of Rosconyll, as fully and freely as he (William) and Geoffrey, formerly Bishop of Ossory, or any other of their ancestors held the same [Ormond Deeds, i. 525]. This William was the holder of the two half knights' fees in the 1317 feodary.
